PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The PACE (Pillar Academy of Continuing Education) program offers a variety of certificate programs as well as individual courses. Most courses are online asynchronous. The duration of each course varies, but is typically between one to four weeks. This program helps you continue your education and obtain career training that connects your passions with your calling, as it helps you stay current in your profession.

WHY SHOULD YOU JOIN OUR CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAM?

Times have changed and so has the job market. While historically, the traditional way to launch or grow a career path was through a degree (whether undergraduate or graduate), students — both college-age and adult — are now looking for other ways to advance and grow their skill sets. A certificate is one-way individuals can achieve training in a specific area to get ahead in their career, build their resume, or pursue a passion.

According to CAEL | EvoLLLution, [a February 2022 study](#) produced by Harvard Business School (HBS) in conjunction with Emsi Burning Glass (Emsi), provides empirical evidence that shows employer preferences have been shifting from degrees to skills. The HBS/Emsi study found that some employers who formerly hired only applicants with degrees now are reducing the use of degree requirements in their job postings. Instead, employers are placing more emphasis on well-defined skills requirements. Based on trends identified in the HBS/Emsi report, its authors project that *“an additional 1.4 million jobs could open to workers without college degrees over the next five years.”*

CAN I EARN COLLEGE CREDITS?

PACE students can earn free electives and general education credits for selected courses at an affordable rate when these credits are transferred and applied to a Pillar College undergraduate degree. This policy offers students an opportunity to save money and graduate from college earlier. To obtain credits, students must confirm with the academic adviser and the PACE office if the courses they need can be satisfied with PACE. Credits can only be transferred to undergraduate programs at Pillar College.

TUITION

Costs for students enrolled in PACE will vary, based on multiple factors:

- Number of required hours for completion
- Class format: Asynchronous or live session
- Level (beginner, intermediate, advanced)
- If the course grants credits, the cost is \$350. All other courses start from \$99
- When available, courses for professional certification generally cost more than regular upskill courses

***The PLA alternative to transfer credits cannot be used for a class in which a student earns a grade below a C.**

CANCELLATION POLICY

If you find it necessary to withdraw from a course, please contact the Director of PACE immediately.

- a) To be eligible for reimbursement for a live class, a student's request to withdraw must be received in writing at least five business days before the in-person course or workshop starts. A \$50 fee will be assessed to any registered student who cancels a class.
- b) Students who give notice of intent to withdraw fewer than five business days before the start of a live course or workshop will receive a credit toward a future course, workshop, or conference, but will be assessed a \$50 fee for their late notice.
- c) If a student is enrolled in an asynchronous class and wants to withdraw, the student must send an email requesting the payment cancellation within 24 hours after registering for the course. A \$50 fee will be assessed to any registered student who contacts us after 48 hours of submitting the payment.
- d) No refunds or credits will be given to students for in-person classes, workshops, or conferences in which they did not attend classes.

COURSES & CERTIFICATES:

PSYCHOLOGY AND COUNSELING

- ❖ **Impacting the Opioid Crisis: Prevention, Education, and Practice for Non-Prescribing Providers (PPSY-0001) Approx. 26 hours to complete or 4 weeks- asynchronous- \$150**

This course will empower non-prescribing providers to directly impact the ongoing opioid crisis in the United States through increased knowledge and tools that will transform practice and

policies. Through lectures, panels and interviews, knowledge checks and quizzes, and additional readings and activities, you can explore topics that are most relevant to your work or practice.

❖ **Addiction Treatment: Clinical Skills for Healthcare Providers (PPSY-0002) Approx. 15 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$250**

This course is designed with a singular goal: to improve the care you provide to your patients with substance use disorders. You will ultimately be prepared to provide compassionate and evidence-based care to a large population of patients living with addiction—a chronic, often relapsing-remitting disease, but a treatable one.

❖ **Health Behavior Change: From Evidence to Action (PPSY-0003) Approx. 15 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$150**

Through a set of experiential learning exercises, students will learn to apply the science of health behavior change in their own lives. The course is appropriate for students interested in health care and public health, as well as individuals who are interested in learning to apply the science of behavior change to improve their personal wellbeing.

❖ **Understanding the Brain: The Neurobiology of Everyday Life (PPSY-0004) Approx. 28 hours to complete or 4 weeks \$150**

Learn how the nervous system produces behavior, how we use our brain every day, and how neuroscience can explain the common problems afflicting people today. We will study functional human neuroanatomy and neuronal communication, and then use this information to understand how we perceive the outside world, move our bodies voluntarily, stay alive, and play well with others.

❖ **Suicide Prevention (PPSY-0005) Approx. 20 hours to complete or 4 weeks- asynchronous- \$99**

How do children overcome hazardous experiences to succeed in life? What can be done to protect young people at risk from trauma, war, disasters, and other adversities? Learn about the importance of fostering resilience in children at risk. During this course, participants will: learn how trauma can affect children and the systems they depend on, gain insight into core concepts, research methods and lessons learned in last 50 years of resilience research, learn how research is being applied in the real world through interventions that promote resilience, and engage in discussions with others who are working with children at risk around the world.

❖ **Resilience in Children Exposed to Trauma, Disaster and War: Global Perspectives (PPSY-0006) Approx. 20 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$150**

How do children overcome hazardous experiences to succeed in life? What can be done to protect young people at risk from trauma, war, disasters, and other adversities? Learn about the importance of fostering resilience in children at risk. During this course, participants will: learn how trauma can affect children and the systems they depend on, gain insight into core concepts, research methods and lessons learned in last 50 years of resilience research, learn how research is being applied in the real world through interventions that promote resilience, and engage in discussions with others who are working with children at risk around the world.

❖ **Understanding child development: from synapse to society (PPSY-0007) Approx. 28 hours to complete or 4 weeks-asynchronous- \$199**

In this course, we dive into the topic of child development. You will learn that child development is complex and is influenced by a surprisingly rich number of factors at many different levels of organization. In order to help you organize your thinking about this complexity you will learn more about the developmental systems approach and theories related to that. We will look, amongst other things, at the brain and motor development, cognitive, language and social-emotional development and all the factors that have an influence on development.

❖ **Positive Psychiatry and Mental Health (PPSY-0008) Approx. 20 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$199**

In this course, we will explore different aspects of good mental health as well as provide an overview of the major kinds of mental disorders, their causes, treatments and how to seek help and support. The course will feature a large number of Australian experts in psychiatry, psychology and mental health research, and we will also hear from "lived experience experts", people who have lived with mental illness, and share their personal stories of recovery.

❖ **Schizophrenia (PPSY-0009) Approx. 6 hours to complete or 3 weeks -asynchronous- \$150**

The main goal of this class is to gain an introductory exposure to the nature of the psychiatric disorder known as schizophrenia as revealed by the scientific method. We will discuss a broad

range of findings from the scientific investigation of biological and psychological factors related to schizophrenia and its treatment.

❖ **Major Depression in the Population: A Public Health Approach (PPSY-0010)**
Approx. 11 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$199

This course illustrates the principles of public health applied to depressive disorder, including principles of epidemiology, transcultural psychiatry, health services research, and prevention. It is predicted that by 2020 depressive disorder will be the most important cause of disease burden in the entire world! Every human being suffers from feeling depressed at some point or other, but only about one fifth of the population will experience an episode of depressive disorder over the course of their lives. This course illuminates the public health approach to disease, and the particular complexities of applying this approach to mental disorders, using depression as the exemplar.

❖ **Introduction to Abnormal Psychology (PPSY-0011) Approx. 14 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$150**

This course presents an overview of the major domains of abnormal psychology. The course is made up of 5 modules, the first of which provides an introduction to the field through discussions of the concept of psychological abnormality, assessment and classification, and the major models in use for understanding psychological abnormality. The course also seeks to assist participants with becoming more adept at noticing when a family member, friend, or colleague may be experiencing psychological distress, as well as develop the comfort level required for initiating an empathic, compassionate conversation with a person of concern. Toward this goal, the last lecture of each module is dedicated to the topic “Foundations of Empathy.”

❖ **Understanding and Managing the Stresses of Police Work (PPSY-0012) Approx. 3 hours to complete or 2 weeks-asynchronous-\$99**

Policing has always been psychologically challenging. On any given shift police officers may encounter a range of psychological challenges including domestic violence, interacting with people experiencing mental health issues, violent crime, even attending the aftermath of horrible accidents. The long exhausting shifts can also result in stressful person interactions within one's personal life. The presence of COVID and political issues related to instances of over-policing have increased these stresses even more. This course has two goals. First, we want to inform officers how their stress system works and why they sometimes feel as they do. With this as a foundation we then describe some strategies officers can use to manage this system, giving

themselves much needed breaks from the stress response and overall empowering them with a greater sense of control over how their bodies react to stress.

❖ **The Addicted Brain (PPSY-0013) Approx. 22 hours to complete or 4 weeks - asynchronous- \$150**

This is a course about addiction to drugs and other behaviors. It will describe what happens in the brain and how this information helps us deal with and overcome addiction. It will also discuss other topics, such as government policy and our vulnerability to take drugs. Skills you will gain: prevention programs, addiction treatment, drug and alcohol abuse treatment.

❖ **Psicología de la Salud Approx. 24 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$150**

En este curso aprenderás los fundamentos conceptuales de la Psicología de la Salud. Comenzaremos con los antecedentes históricos acerca del estudio de los componentes subjetivos y de comportamiento en el proceso salud-enfermedad y de la atención de la salud. EDUCATION/ TEACHING

❖ **Kids with Cancer Still Need School: The Providers Role (PEDU-0001) Approx. 3 hours to complete or 4 weeks-asynchronous- \$99**

This course will help you understand and address the challenges parents and families face regarding schooling after a cancer diagnosis. This course gives you easy access to Roadmaps that help parents learn and take action so their child can access schooling supports for which they are eligible. We hope that completing this course will help you make small changes in your everyday practice that can make a big change in how well parents can advocate for their child's schooling needs.

❖ **Managing Asthma, Allergies, Diabetes, and Seizures in School (PEDU-0002) Approx. 15 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$199**

In this course, you will learn about these common medical issues students face and how to best support students who suffer from them. We will also take a holistic look at how we can best support overall student health. As part of the course, we will introduce two students to help all of this information come alive. Prepare yourself to learn about these common medical conditions. Let's get started!

❖ **Managing ADHD, Autism, Learning Disabilities, and Concussion in School (PEDU-0003) Approx. 9 hours to complete or 4 weeks-asynchronous- \$199**

In this course, you will learn about the most common developmental and behavioral disorders affecting children such as ADHD, autism spectrum disorder, learning disorders, and concussions. We will focus on how schools can support children by recognizing common symptoms and understanding the diagnosis process.

❖ **Learning to Teach Online (PEDU-0004) Approx. 18 hours to complete or 4 weeks - asynchronous- \$150**

The course is based upon the multi award winning open educational resource developed by Dr Simon McIntyre and Karin Watson. Integrating online technologies into your teaching can be a challenging prospect, and it can be difficult to know how to approach it effectively for the benefit of both students and yourself. No one knows your own content and teaching strengths better than you, and the “one size fits all” formula doesn’t always suit everyone. No matter what type of technology you are interested in exploring or your level of experience, this course will help you draw on your teaching strengths and find the approach that is right for you, your students and your educational context.

❖ **Online Education: The foundations of online teaching (PEDU-0005) Approx. 21 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$150**

In a world that's quickly becoming dominated by mobile technology, flexible working opportunities and a post-pandemic economy, online learning is here to stay. The course will cover questions such as: What is online learning and how does it differ from learning in traditional classroom settings? Do the needs of online learners differ from their face-to-face counterparts? How can I design online learning so that it reflects and meets the needs of my learners? Which tools and resources are readily available and easy to master for facilitating engaging and interactive online learning? These questions and many more will be answered in this course, which is designed for teachers and educators who are new to online learning, or those who are preparing to adapt existing learning resources to an online learning environment.

❖ **Educating Deaf Children: Becoming an Empowered Teacher (PEDU-0006) Approx. 16 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$150**

Many Deaf children around the world still leave school functionally illiterate. In some cases there is no allowance made for the education of deaf children at all. This 4-week course provides you with invaluable knowledge and skills about teaching Deaf children. You will learn about the importance of Deaf culture and community, the need for a language rich environment for the Deaf child from as young as possible, and that having access to sign language can help Deaf children academically, emotionally, and socially. We also cover various accommodations and modifications that you can apply in your classroom and learning environment to create an accessible learning experience for Deaf children. This course does not teach sign language since each country has its own sign language. We hope that through this course you become an empowered teacher - for yourself, for your fellow teachers, and most importantly, for the Deaf children in your classroom.

❖ **Teaching Character and Creating Positive Classrooms (PEDU-0007) Approx. 10 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$150**

Positive psychology meets K-12 pedagogy. This course explores key ideas of positive psychology and shows how great teachers apply those lessons to maximize student engagement and accomplishment. Through lectures, discussions, interviews and footage of great educators in action, you'll learn how to integrate character-based objectives into your own teaching.

❖ **K-12 Blended & Online Learning (PEDU-0008) Approx. 15 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$199**

This course introduces teachers and interested adults to K12 blended and online learning. Participants will design a blended or online unit and develop one module to use with K12 students.

❖ **Uncommon Sense Teaching (PEDU-0009) Approx. 16 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$199**

This is like no other course on teaching—it weaves late-breaking insights from neuroscience with personal insights from the classroom to provide unexpected, yet practical, new approaches. You'll discover how to bring out the best from all your students in today's diverse teaching environment, where students often have a wide range of abilities. Uncommon Sense Teaching will take your teaching to a higher level for whatever subjects you teach, whether math, physics, literature, dance, art, or anything else; and whether you are teaching K-12, university, business, vocational, or at home.

CULTURES AND LANGUAGES

- ❖ **Introduction to Korean Philosophy and Culture (PCUL-0001) Approx. 12 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$299**

This course will give you the cultural and historical background to begin your journey into Korean philosophy, and there is no prerequisite knowledge on philosophy required. Anybody who either has an interest in Korean culture, maybe through K-Dramas or K-pop, or an interest in philosophy from a cross-cultural perspective, are all welcome. Despite the growing interest in Korean culture, there are few courses which explore the fascinating topic of Korean philosophy. On this course, you'll be introduced to concepts in Korean philosophy through an exploration of the Korean language, culture and perspective.

- ❖ **A Bridge to the World: Korean Language for Beginners I (PCUL-0002) Approx. 17 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$299**

This course is an introductory course to Korean language that aims to cultivate basic communication skill for those that are interested in learning Korean language. The course is composed of essential expressions that are often used in everyday life and designed to teach grammars using basic dialogues which reflect colloquial characteristics of Korean language so by end of this course, a student will be able to express him/herself on ordinary topics. Also, the course provides dialogues used in both formal and informal situations to help students to express in Korean language appropriately in particular situations and provides various material to help students to understand unique culture of Korean language.

- ❖ **Chinese Culture and Contemporary China (PCUL-0005) Approx. 12 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$299**

This course of Chinese Culture and Contemporary China will explore the foundations of Chinese civilization and the dimensions of Chinese culture. It will pay particular attention to the relationship between Chinese culture and the present-day life of the Chinese people and to the different elements of the culture which are under the present social structures, belief systems, literature, arts, customs, etc. The course aims at providing students with a deeper knowledge of Chinese culture, thus enabling them to better understand China.

- ❖ **Israel State and Society (PCUL-0006) Approx. 22 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$299**

Israel is a country that draws a lot of public attention around the globe. Nevertheless, both those who support Israel and those who are critical of its geopolitical standing and policies, usually have a very limited knowledge about the Israeli society and its political system. This course presents

Israel from multiple perspectives - political, social, economic and cultural - in an attempt to expose the learners to a cutting-edge academic research on the country.

❖ **Spanish for Successful Communication in Healthcare Settings (PCUL-0007) Approx. 24 hours to complete or 4 weeks-asynchronous- \$299**

Welcome to Spanish for Successful Communication in Healthcare Settings! This course is structured in four modules, each one revolving on a topic related to the physician-patient interaction. Each module contains four lessons: on grammar, vocabulary, the dynamics of the spoken interaction, and aspects of sociocultural relevance. The video lessons are unlike regular “lectures” in which you are just listening. Instead, you should think of them as virtual classes where you are supposed to reflect, complete activities, and even get extra practice on your own time. The videos are a roadmap that will provide what you need to complete the activities on the student handout. Each module is followed by a 10-question quiz. It is important that you complete the lessons sequentially, as they build upon each other.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT/ HOBBIES

❖ **Women in Leadership: Inspiring Positive Change (PDEV-0001) Approx. 13 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$150**

This course aims to inspire and empower women and men across the world to engage in purposeful career development and take on leadership for important causes---to lead change with more conviction and confidence---and improve our workplaces and communities for all. By offering more complex understandings of issues related to professional women and work, the course will help you increase self-knowledge about your own values and vision, as well as enhance your capabilities as a leader, manager, and team contributor. We will examine the opportunities, challenges, trade-offs, and organizational dynamics experienced by women in work organizations, as well as reflect on and practice effective individual behaviors.

❖ **The Science of Success: What Researchers Know that You Should Know (PDEV-0002) Approx. 11 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$150**

This engaging course is designed to help you achieve the success that you desire. Drawing on decades of scientific research, you will learn what the most successful people do differently than others, why IQ is not the most significant predictor of success (and can sometimes backfire), and why many commonly held beliefs hold people back from achieving their goals. Although this course is based on the science of success, you will learn many practical ideas that you can apply to your own life immediately, particularly in three main areas: Getting better results at work (and

school) • Achieving career success (however you define success) • Enjoying a meaningful, happy, and healthy life.

❖ **Fundamentals of Music Theory (PDEV-0003) Approx. 12 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$299**

This course, revised in 2022, will introduce you to the theory of music, providing you with the skills needed to read and write Western music notation, as well as to understand, analyze, and listen informedly. It will cover material such as pitches and scales, intervals, clefs, rhythm, form, metre and time signatures, phrases and cadences, and basic harmony. This course covers the fundamentals of Western music theory, from the absolute basics to some more advanced concepts. As such, it is the perfect course for beginners and more experienced musicians alike.

Emotional intelligence, hope, mindfulness, and compassion help a person reverse the damage of chronic stress and build great leadership relationships. The Positive and Negative Emotional Attractors inspire sustained, desired change and learning at many levels.

❖ **Art & Activity: Interactive Strategies for Engaging with Art (PDEV-0007) Approx. 9 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$199**

Art can be a powerful catalyst for building skills and understanding a range of subjects. Intended for primary and secondary teachers of all disciplines, Art & Activity builds upon the inquiry-based approaches of Art and Inquiry: Museum Teaching Strategies for Your Classroom, while delving into activity-based strategies that will make your students empowered participants.

BUSINESS/ ENTREPRENEURSHIP/ MARKETING

- ❖ **International Business and Culture (PBUS-0001) Approx. 12 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$250**

In this course, learners develop a solid understanding of how national cultures shape international human resource management, international marketing, and international business generally. The course provides an overview of international culture, human resource management (HRM), and marketing. This may seem like a peculiar grouping of topics, but successful international HR management and marketing are highly dependent on national culture. Without understanding a people's culture, managing and selling to those people is fraught.

- ❖ **How to Create a Good Business (PBUS-0002) Approx. 23 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$299**

Prioritizing the wellbeing of workers is not just a good - or ethical - thing to do, but because it makes business sense. A happier, healthier workforce is a more productive workforce. A productive workforce is more likely to attend, perform their best work, and add more value to an organization. In this course, you'll unpack what "worker wellbeing" means across different contexts, explore how to use research techniques to find the sweet spot between worker interests and firm interests, and understand how to design scalable solutions to enable both parties to thrive.

- ❖ **Financial Markets (PBUS-0003) Approx. 33 hours to complete or 4 weeks - asynchronous- \$250**

An overview of the ideas, methods, and institutions that permit human society to manage risks and foster enterprise. Emphasis on financially savvy leadership skills. Description of practices today and analysis of prospects for the future. Introduction to risk management and behavioral finance principles to understand the real-world functioning of securities, insurance, and banking industries. The ultimate goal of this course is using such industries effectively and towards a better society.

to corporates, and across a range of industrial segments. The problem this course helps address is the constant pressure managers face to be innovative and introduce novel products and services for their customers. However, many creative ideas get 'stuck' in the boardroom or are subject to intra-organizational tensions or group thinking. This course provides methodologies to break through these challenges.

❖ **Managing the Company of the Future (PBUS-0006) Approx. 12 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$299.**

The aim of the course is to provide you with a comprehensive framework for understanding both the traditional principles of management inside companies today as well as the alternative principles that are becoming increasingly important. It provides both theoretical and practical perspectives on the nature of management in today's organizations.

❖ **Brand Management: Aligning Business, Brand and Behavior (PBUS-0007) Approx. 17 hours to complete or 4 weeks -asynchronous- \$299**

The aim of the course is to change the conception of brands as being an organization's visual identity (e.g., logo) and image (customers' brand associations) to an experience along "moments-that-matter" along the customer journey and, therefore, delivered by people across the entire organization. Brands are thus not only an external promise to customers, but a means of executing business strategy via internal brand-led behavior and culture change. You will learn and practice the following skills: 1. How to build brands from a broad organizational perspective 2. How to lead brand-led culture change with human resource practices at the core (i.e., brand as a lever and not just an outcome) 3. How to build brands in multi-brand companies, across cultures and geographies 4. How to measure brand health in new ways, that is, internally in addition to externally 5. How to value and capture returns to brands across the organization - introducing the new concept of employee-based brand equity - and how this is different from the valuation of brands as intangible assets.

To what extent are these processes unconscious and cannot be reflected in overt reports? This course will provide you with an introduction to some of the most basic methods in the emerging fields of consumer neuroscience and neuromarketing. You will learn about the methods employed and what they mean. You will learn about the basic brain mechanisms in consumer choice, and how to stay updated on these topics. The course will give an overview of the current and future uses of neuroscience in business.

They will engage with expertly produced videos, gain insight from industry experts, participate in knowledge assessments, practice assessing their environmental awareness, and gain access to materials that address governance and risk management, compliance, business continuity and disaster recovery, cryptography, software development security, access control, network security, security architecture, security operations, and physical and environmental security. We will point you to relevant open and free resources to assist you.

This course aims to teach everyone the basics of programming computers using Python. We cover the basics of how one constructs a program from a series of simple instructions in Python. The course has no pre-requisites and avoids all but the simplest mathematics. Anyone with moderate computer experience should be able to master the materials in this course. This course will cover Chapters 1-5 of the textbook “Python for Everybody”. Once a student completes this course, they will be ready to take more advanced programming courses. This course covers Python 3.

In this course, you will learn about important intermediate verb tenses, including present perfect, present perfect progressive, past perfect, and past perfect progressive. You will also learn about common modal verbs used in English. This course is designed for learners who have a basic understanding of English grammar but who want to learn more and improve their skills for everyday speaking or writing, as well as for academics. It will be a fun class with lots of entertaining and informative video lectures.

❖ **Beginner Level: Questions, Present Progressive and Future Tenses. Approx. 9 hours to complete or 4 weeks \$150**

In this course, “Questions, Present Progressive and Future Tenses,” you will learn about question words in English and how to form questions in the simple present. Then you will learn how to form the present progressive to express ideas about things that are happening right now. You will look at the differences between the simple present and present progressive. Finally, you will learn how to use “to be going to” and the present progressive to talk about the future and how to use “can” to talk about ability.

❖ **Beginner Level: Simple Past Tense. Approx. 9 hours to complete or 4 weeks \$150**

In this course, “Simple Past Tense,” you will learn how to form and use the simple past. You will see that there are a lot of irregular verbs in the simple past, but there are some patterns you can use to help you remember. You will learn about spelling changes when you add an “-ed” ending, as well as how to form negatives and questions in the past. You will also learn about object pronouns and some other forms of adjectives to describe and make comparisons.
